FSC exists to take children camping. We believe that learning to do things for themselves is the most important lesson we can teach. We encourage both mental and physical activity as a means to developing self-reliance and a concern for the well-being of others.

The summer standing camps are central to this and provide a training in basic camp-craft which then enables children to enjoy more demanding activities. One of the most popular parts of these camps is often 'going out on hike'. Despite the reluctance with which the hike is planned, the children usually return with comments like, 'It was super and we walked for miles; We wanted to stay out for another day.' Their doubts about walking and carrying a loaded rucsac have vanished with the discovery that by so doing they have gained a large measure of independence and freedom to go where they will.

To encourage this spirit of adventure and self-sufficiency we also run mobile camps. In these a greater proportion or even the whole of the camp is spent on the move, usually on foot or by canoe. In some cases a camp is described as semi-mobile which can mean a variety of different things; there may be a base from which expeditions are made or one may be on the move for most of the time, but with a vehicle or boat to carry part of the luggage. Each camp will be different from the last.

It is this wide variety which most children enjoy. They may 'go to camp' every year, but each time they will do something different. So that their choice and hence their enjoyment shall be as great as possible, we urge all campers to try all types of camps. If you don't, you won't know what you're missing!

This would increase the costs were it not offset by the great generosity shown by various individuals and Charities, to whom we are most grateful. If parents feel their child would enjoy camping we would ask them not to let the cost deter them from applying, because we may be able to arrange financial assistance.

ARRANGEMENTS FOR ENROLMENT

The programmes are sent out early in January with enrolment forms. We indicate which colour form to use for applying for Summer, Easter, Whitsun or weekend camps. They should be returned to the appropriate Enrolment Secretary. All addresses will be found on the back of the programme.

Priority for places goes first to old campers (as we wish to encourage children to come back year after year to camp with us to make FSC a continuing experience for them), secondly to siblings (as we hope to include all members of a family in our camps), and then to those on the waiting list who have shown their continuing interest even if previously unsuccessful in getting a place.

Please fill in three choices on the forms for Summer and Easter camps. Any forms received with less than three choices will be dealt with last. We try to give as many children as possible their first choice, but of course this is impossible for everyone and we therefore need to know your alternatives. All camps are for both boys and girls and we try to balance the sexes in each age group. If all three camps are full in your child's age group, the Enrolments Secretary will try to offer you a place at another camp during the same dates. It is helpful if members of a family are willing to go to different camps, and also if parents will realise that it is sometimes difficult to put friends on the same camp. Please reassure your child that most children go alone to camp and quickly make new friends. After they have been to a few camps they will often meet old FSC friends again.

WHAT IS CAMP LIKE?

Standing Camps are our main Summer and Easter camps and we like children to come to these for their first few times. New children should not enrol for Easter camps unless they have had camping experience elsewhere or are hardy and determined. At Standing Camps we impart some of the basic camping skills. The children learn to put up a tent, to look after their possessions and keep them dry. They learn to gather and cut wood, to make fires and to cook food. All this is to prepare for the hike that takes place in the middle of the camp. Each age group goes with staff for a distance suitable for the age and strength of its members. During the hike the children usually plan, buy (with camp funds) and cook their own food, with help when needed.

Other events during the camp may include swimming, exploring, night walks, country dancing, camp fires and various FSC games. At the end of camp a Merrymoot is held when the whole camp gathers round a roaring fire to entertain each other with a mixture of songs, sketches and improvisations.

After a few Standing Camps many children then try a Semi-Mobile or Mobile Camp, travelling on foot or by canoe, the campers buy their food every few days and cook in small groups. Some Mobiles are very strenuous and others easier—the descriptions in the programme give you more information.

We send new parents a camping gear leaflet to help their children bring the right clothes and equipment with them. Extra wool sweaters, a long sleeved shirt and extra trousers are a good idea. Midges bite bare arms and legs in the evenings! If it is very cold we find it better to wear one jersey (over-large) on top of another. For Easter camps woolly hats, gloves, wellingtons and two sleeping bags are strongly recommended.
